

NOKOMIS CENTER REVITALIZATION

Project: BAY POINT PARK ACCESS (RC-6)

Project Type: County Project

Project and Background Description:

Improve the pedestrian access to Bay Point Park by providing an opening in cable line across the wood pilings.

Bay Point Park and the adjoining County right-of-way make up a beautiful well-maintained passive-use neighborhood park (approximately 0.7 acres) with access to Lyons Bay. Pedestrian and bicycle access, however, is limited due to cable lines with no openings strung across the wood pilings along the roadway. The site includes a drainage ditch along the south property line that drains directly into the bay.

Pedestrian and bicycle access to the park should be improved by providing an opening on Lyons Bay Road and by adding a sign with the name of the park. Other amenities to the park should include benches near the water.

Preliminary Cost Estimates:

• Improve pedestrian opening	\$1,500
• Add park sign and benches (2)	\$1,300
<i>Total Estimated Cost</i>	<i>\$2,800</i>

Potential Funding Source(s):

Parks and Recreation.

Implementation Time Frame: Short term, one year.

Responsible Parties: Community Services Parks and Recreation

Steps Required to Implement:

- Produce a work order to add park sign, benches, and provide opening in cable.

Issues Requiring Further Analysis/Action:

1. Evaluate opportunities for stormwater management improvements for bay water quality.
